# **Target Setting**

In 2019, the school had set the following statutory target for the end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6) 89.0% of pupils to achieve the expected level in all subjects (Level 4).

# **Curriculum Statement Foundation Phase**

Learning for children aged 3-7 years is based on the Welsh Government Foundation Phase Curriculum. This curriculum is well grounded in educational research and based on an understanding of how children learn.

In nursery and reception there is one adult to every 10 children in year 1 and 2 there is one adult to every 15 children. This enables staff to care for these very young children and to observe their learning carefully in order to plan next steps.

The curriculum is planned in topics which interest children, offering creative and practical learning opportunities. Key skills in literacy, numeracy and ICT are taught in a structured way in all areas of learning.

The seven Areas of Learning are:

- Personal and Social Development, Well-Being and Cultural Diversity
- Language, Literacy and Communication Skills
- Mathematical Development
- Welsh Language Development
- Knowledge and Understanding of the World
- Physical Development
- Creative Development.

Personal and Social Development, Well-Being and Cultural Diversity is at the heart of the Foundation Phase."

#### **Key Stage Two**

Pupils from years 3 to 6 follow the national curriculum for Wales. This is a skills based curriculum. Topics of interest to children are linked to national curriculum subjects and these provide the context for children to develop both subject skills and also literacy numeracy and IT skills which are needed in every subject area.

The subject areas in the national curriculum are English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, RE Music, PE. Welsh, Art and Design and Technology. Personal and social education is a cross curricular theme which is taught daily, weekly though other topics and theme days.

# **Additional Learning Needs**

The national curriculum is taught to all pupils unless there are any special arrangements for disapplication for specific reasons such as medical or particular learning needs. Pupils who have additional educational needs are supported in classrooms and sometimes taught in small groups or as individuals.

Our Additional Learning Needs Coordinator (ALNCo) works across the school with all year groups. She liaises with staff and parents and outside agencies ensuring that children's needs are identified and they are given all the support they need to meet their individual targets. She runs reading workshops for parents each term and has at least one meeting each term with parents. She is always available for extra consultations when parents wish them.

Classroom Assistants also play an important role in supporting children's specific needs in literacy and numeracy.

Some pupils may access our catch up programmes for a period of time in order to accelerate their progress. These children are not on the special needs register.

#### **Communication and Partnership with Parents**

A summary newsletter is sent home once per month. This highlights events and learning priorities, gives important information and also highlights our thoughts and values. These newsletters are also available on our school website <a href="www.mineraprimary.com">www.mineraprimary.com</a>. Other letters are sent home as nessecary. Our text message service, Twitter and Facebook accounts gives reminders of up and coming events.

Our website has been fully developed to include more relevant information and to become a 'one stop shop' for all information regarding school.

Meetings are held for induction and extra information sessions. Parents meetings ae held in the Autumn and Spring Term.

#### **Toilets**

The school provides sufficient toilets for number of pupils on roll. These toilets are cleaned on a daily basis.

#### **Health and Fitness**

The development of healthy lifestyles is a high priority for our school. Minera School has achieved Phase 4 of the Healthy Schools initiative and actively promotes healthy eating. A fruit snack is provided for Foundation Phase and pupils have access to drinking water throughout the day.

The children take part in a range of activities to ensure that they feel safe and staff and governors receive annual child protection training. We have a comprehensive PSHE curriculum addressed through class, worship and circle times. The school has robust safeguarding and child protection procedures including safe recruitment.

#### Welsh Language

Pupils are educated through the medium of English. Welsh is taught as a second language and is used as part of the Welsh lessons, as incidental Welsh throughout the day, across the curriculum where possible and during collective worship. We ensure that all pupils are supported in the learning of Welsh as a second language and recognise their varied linguistic backgrounds

#### **Church and Community Links**

We have strong links with St Mary's Church in Minera. Rev Harris regularly visits school and leads our Collective Worship based on the church year and tour Christian Values.

We have held some church led visits – children visit the church as part of trail and take part in Diddy Disciples.

We hold regular services at St Mary's including Harvest, Advent, Christmas Presentations, Ash Wednesday, Pentecost and Year 6 Leaver's Celebration. The services are well supported by the school community.

#### **Friends of Minera**

We are very grateful to our parents association. They work hard to raise money for the school and to create events which bring the school community together. They also work hard to ensure a smooth handover each year with certain people providing continuity while encouraging new members to take over committee roles. It is a very professional organisation.
