

REDEMPTION PEORIA | LITURGY FOR THE LORD'S DAY

May 10, 2020 | The Fifth Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday!

People of God,

Although we cannot be together as our normal practice allows, we have an exciting (and oddly packaged) opportunity to join together in spirit with one another and with the early church by worshiping as they worshiped: in our homes with those closest to us. We encourage you to use the following liturgy (simply translated as "the work of the people") to worship with your household. This is a guide, not a rule. You may feel free to change anything to fit your abilities as worshipers.

Those with gifts for music, prayer, speaking, etc. are encouraged to lead as they are able. If there is a musician in the household, they are especially encouraged to lead; this would be preferred over the provided recordings. Or, perhaps you read the lyrics together, utilizing them for the poems that they are. Those words may jump out differently than they do when you sing them.

And much like our early church brothers and sisters – use the gifts available to you. Lead as skillfully as you are able. Be creative. Glorify God. Seek to be formed into the image of Christ.

In other words: WORSHIP.

We suggest that you gather with a group of no more than 10 individuals if possible, or perhaps alone or with your family. Of course, if you have had known contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19, or if you are experiencing symptoms of any kind, we ask that you refrain from gathering with anyone outside your household. In terms of how to proceed with this liturgy, feel free to assign parts depending on your circumstances. However, we would make the following suggestion: Select a leader who will read all the "LEADER" parts. Everyone else should read the "ALL" parts. For our usual Sunday feel, think of them as "Y'ALL" parts, even. If you're alone, remember that you're not alone. You have the Father, Son, and Spirit with you as you're guided by them through the Word.

NOTE

Before you jump in, take a few moments to listen to this and remember you're not alone.

LISTEN

A COLLECT FOR COVID-19

ALL:

Almighty and merciful God, whose blessed Son our Savior Jesus Christ healed lepers, the blind, the lame, and the deaf, and who calmed the storm:

Grant healing for those who have been infected with COVID-19, protection for those who have been exposed, and comfort for all who have fears and anxieties, that we might know his loving presence and make him known: who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit.

One God, for ever and ever. Amen.

GOD CALLS US TO WORSHIP

We begin our time with a call to worship to remember together that worship starts with God, not us.

CALL TO WORSHIP | Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7 NLT

LEADER 1: Come, let us sing to the LORD! Let us shout joyfully to the Rock of our salvation.

ALL: Let us come to him with thanksgiving. Let us sing psalms of praise to him.

LEADER 2: Come, let us worship and down down. Let us kneel before the LORD our

maker, for his is our God. We are the people he watches over,

the flock under his care.

ALL: If only we would listen to his voice today!

PRAYER OF ADORATION

PROMPTS: Praise God for his power, mighty works.

Thank God for His presence when we gather to worship.

Praise God for His faithfulness to His people, no matter the circumstance.

CONFESSION, LAMENT & RENEWAL

A healthy reorientation to the reality that God is holy, we are sinners. and Jesus saves us.

We recognize on a day like today that everything in God's creation isn't as it should be. Sin has broken families and caused deep pain and heartache, and suffering in creation has led to suffering in the flesh – some who long to be parents are unable to experience that joy. Some who long to be cared for lose their parents. Some parents have recently lost children.

We recognize on a day like today that everything in God's creation isn't as it should be. Let's pray and lament this together, knowing that God hears us in our pain and sadness.

A MOTHER'S DAY LAMENT

LEADER 1: Lord, Creator and giver of every good gift, we recall your creation isn't as it should be. Sin has broken what was good and inflicted pain.

On this day, we lift up to you the hearts that ache for healing in their family; who long to be mothers, but mourn the absence of new life within them; who have conceived, but suffered loss through miscarriage or abortion; who have given birth, but endured the tragedy of burying a child.

Their grief is often hidden from us or neglected on this day of celebration,

and we pray that they may experience healing in this church family.

LEADER 2: We also grieve with those who have lost their mothers – from physical death to physical and/or emotional abandonment. Bring comfort, O Lord.

LEADER 3: And for mothers with strained relationships with their children. We pray for reconciliation that only you can make a way for. Bring healing, O Lord.

ALL: How long, O Lord, must sin and death get its way? How long must joy be

deferred or interrupted by such cruel sorrow?

Risen Lord of life, grant comfort and peace, and breathe in us all the breath of new life – through Jesus Christ, who defeated sin and death. Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON IN THE GOSPEL | Revelation 21:3-5

LEADER: I hear a loud shout from the throne, saying, "Look, God's home is now

among his people! He will live with them, and they will be his people.

God himself will be with them.

ALL: He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death

or sorrow or crying or pain. All these things are gone forever."

LEADER: And the one sitting on the throne said, "Look, I am making everything new!"

PASSING OF THE PEACE | God doesn't just reconcile us to Himself, but also to each other.

LEADER: Your Word, O Lord, is a lamp to our feet;

ALL: Without it we lose our way.

HEARING GOD'S WORD

"Do you want to hear God speak? Read the Bible out loud." - John Piper

SCRIPTURE READING | Romans 14:10

LEADER: Why do you pass judgment on your brother? Or you, why do you despise your

brother? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God;

LEADER: This is the Word of the Lord!

ALL: Thanks be to God!

PROFESSION OF FAITH | Heidelberg Catechism, Q & A 1

LEADER: What is your only comfort in life and in death?

That I belong – body and soul, in life and in death – not to myself, but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ, who at the cost of His own blood has fully paid for all my sins and has completely freed me from the dominion of the devil; that He protects me so well that without the will of my Father in heaven not a hair can fall from my head; indeed, that everything must fit His purpose for my salvation. Therefore, by His Holy Spirit, He also assures me of eternal life, and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for Him.

SONG | "WE WILL FEAST IN THE HOUSE OF ZION" | LISTEN & SING

ALL: We will feast in the house of Zion; we will sing with our hearts restored "He has done great things!", we will say together We will feast and weep no more

We will not be burned by the fire – He is the Lord, our God We are not consumed by the flood – upheld, protected, gathered up (chorus)

LEADER 3: May the hand of God protect you,

the way of God lie before you, the shield of God defend you, and the host of God save you.

LEADER 4: May Christ shield you today.

Go in the knowledge that Christ is with you and walk in the Spirit.
