# Holy Week @ home


WHAT IS IT? WHY DOES IT MATTER? WHAT CAN I DO?

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday - this year on Sunday 5th April. Palm Sunday starts as Jesus entered into Jerusalem, riding on a donkey, and was welcomed as a king. Just days later, the same crowd would demanded Jesus' death on the Cross. As we iourney through Holy Week we walk with Jesus, as He celebrated His last meal with His friends and gave us the gift of Himself through the Eucharist, and to the Cross. Jesus' death was awful, and it can be hard to understand...

### Why did this happen?

Because we were separated from God by sin and death. Jesus took upon Himself the sins of every person who ever has, is, and will live. He overcame death by rising to new life and opening the gates of Heaven to all of us.

Why would God allow this? God loves each of us as His beloved child. Imagine asking one child to die to save another, when you love them both completely... It would be impossible. So God knew the only way to enable us to be with Him for eternity in Heaven was to undertake it Himself. Jesus is truly God, and truly human.



#### What does it all mean?

Particularly appropriate at this time, the Easter story is a story of hope. In a turbulent world where death, illness, suffering and pain can seem overwhelming. God has been through the very worst of human pain and suffering, and He is with us in ours if we allow ourselves to find Him within it. Walking to the Cross with Jesus reminds us that God has the ability to take our very worst and to make it His very best - a story of hope and love.
