40-Day Journey to the Cross

Throughout church history, the 40 days before Easter Sunday has held special significance for Christians. This period, known as Lent, has been used for personal reflection, fasting, and prayer as God's people prepare themselves to celebrate the resurrection of Christ.

This year, as we continue the *Transforming Generations* vision of our church, WHCC is inviting you to join *40-Day Journey to the Cross*. We will read through a selection of Scripture on God's redemptive plan for the sacrificial death of Jesus the Messiah, culminating with the passion narrative in Matthew as we prepare our hearts for the Holy Week of Easter.

If you do not have a consistent devotional habit or plan right now, this is the perfect opportunity to get started. This daily reading and reflection take 10 to 15 minutes as you read 10 to 15 verses each day. Since the traditional counting of 40 days of Lent does not include Sundays, this reading schedule also gives our readers a chance to catch up should you fall behind.

In the Bible, the number 40 carries a special connotation of the process of testing and maturation. The Israelites were in the wilderness for 40 years. Jesus was tested in the wilderness for 40 days. Research also shows it usually takes 30 to 40 days of consistent practice to develop a new habit. We invite you to embark on this *40-Day Journey to the Cross* and allow the Bible's powerful words to transform your life as we journey to the cross together.

Your Communion with God through Devotional Reading

Read: Quiet your heart, turn off any distractions, let go of your straying thoughts, and give yourself to the Lord. Read the Scripture for the day slowly, while letting the words guide you heart. Are there any words or phrases that catch your attention? Consider their meaning.

Reflect: Let the word of God illuminate you, considering the reason the Lord wants you to read these words today. What do these verses reveal about God's grace? What is the Lord saying to you through these words? Take time to consider the heart of God behind the words. Let the reflection question guide you.

Respond: Meditate and talk to the Lord about how you will respond to His words for you today. Consider any promises to claim, attitudes to change, challenges to accept, sins to confess, commands to obey, actions to take, examples to follow. Focus on one take-away action item for today.

Rest: After you have responded to God's Word, receive His word gratefully, quietly resting in His love for you. Prayerfully commit yourself to live according to His Word.
