

REDEMPTION PEORIA | LITURGY FOR THE LORD'S DAY

June 7, 2020 | Trinity Sunday

TRINITY SUNDAY

Traditionally celebrated the first Sunday after Pentecost, Trinity Sunday celebrates the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, the three Persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

And while it is true that Trinity Sunday is unlike Pentecost and Christmas in that it doesn't focus on a particular historical narrative, it's not true to say that the Trinity is not tied to an event or that it is simply a disembodied or ahistorical idea. The trinitarian nature of God is actually reflected in every celebration of the liturgical year. At Christmas, for example, we remember the Holy Spirit's work in Jesus' conception (Luke 1:35). At Easter, we celebrate that God raised Jesus from the dead (Acts 4:10). At Pentecost, we read New Testament texts that assert that the Father and the Son send the Spirit to us (John 14:16; 15:26).

So think of Trinity Sunday as the "coda" on the unfolding drama of the year from Christmas to Pentecost – an opportunity to linger on what the entire history means about the nature of the God we worship. Trinity Sunday also allows us to sense how this trinitarian dynamic extends to us – even in worship.

The Father receives our worship, the Son perfects it, and the Spirit prompts it.

The doctrine of the Trinity helps us realize that God is not simply the passive receiver of our worship, but the active agent who makes it even possible. That single claim entirely changes how we think about what we are doing when we gather for worship, however it is that we may gather at this point in history.
