| Main Idea                 | God: God is our Creator. He doesn't need anything. He judges sin and redeems His people. He is different from other gods. He is the one true God.  |
| Scripture                 | Psalm 50:9-12; Romans 11:36  |
| This Month's Memory Verse | <i>"For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen." Romans 11:36</i><br><br><u>Stand Up:</u> Have family members begin seated. Call out groups of people to stand up and recite the verse together. For example, "If you're wearing sparkles, stand up! If you like cheese pizza, stand up!" |
| Activity                  | <u>Musical Spots:</u> write "God" on one piece of paper, and place it along with the others in a circle on the floor. Play music as family members walk around the spots, then pause it. When the music stops, whoever is on the God spot wins. Discuss all the other things we worship, and that God is the only true God.          |
| Craft                     | <u>Royal Crown:</u> draw a crown on a paper and have kids glue jewels or sparkles or confetti or anything shiny or sparkly onto it. Remind them that God is the King of the world.   |
| Service                   | Make a card or picture and leave it for a first responder you know.  |
| Prayer                    | Thank You, God, for who You are, and that it is perfect. Praise You that You don't need anything, and that You're the one true God. Forgive us for forgetting who You really are, or for trying to make You like us. Help us to understand You more.   |
| Catechism                 | Question #51: Of what advantage to us is Christ's ascension? Christ is now advocating for us in the presence of his father and also sends us his Spirit.   |
